

Investment Oversight, Policy and Distributions

The Foundation receives oversight from a Board of Directors and contracts with professional, independent investment consultants to oversee its investments, ensuring investment goals and objectives are met. The CHS Foundation's Master Investment Policy dictates the following:

General Objectives


The Board employs investment professionals to oversee and invest the assets within the parameters of the Investment Policy.

CHS Foundation Board Responsibilities

The Board and its Investment Advisor review the investment objectives and restrictions based on current capital market conditions or the Foundation's financial position. The Board realizes the necessity of a long-term horizon when formulating investment policies and strategies.

Distribution Policy

The Foundation's Spend Policy applies to all endowed funds unless a particular endowment creator has stipulated spending requests. The annual spend amount is currently equal to 4.25% the average market value of assets for the past three years.
