**More than half** of surveyed residents have not received needed mental health care due to a lack of availability of mental health providers.

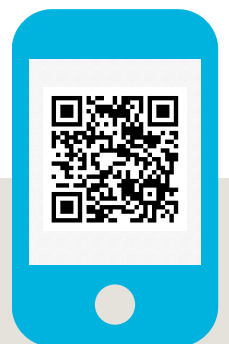

If you're experiencing a mental health crisis, call **(386) 872-2254**. Within an hour, a Mobile Response Team counselor will respond to your location to provide de-escalation, a risk assessment, safety planning coping skill development and more.

**Telehealth is available for a faster response.**

In the coming days and weeks we provide crisis counseling, followed by a warm hand-off to resources and support **in our own community**, including mental health counseling, targeted case management, psychiatric services & more.
