Children's Home Society of Florida's Board of Directors approved on September 5th, 2025

We offer the following legislative priorities for the 2026 Legislature to consider:

Expand a Proven Model to Success: Community Partnership Schools

Community Partnership Schools eliminate barriers to learning that can prevent many children from reaching their full potential: poverty, hunger, safe housing, and unmet health and mental health needs. Community Partnership Schools address these issues and create greater long-term access to services and supports for students and their families, which can positively impact their futures.

Recovery of Unpaid Services Provided to Children in the Child Welfare System Following the Embrace Families CBC Closure

Children's Home Society of Florida was a provider of case management services in Orange, Osceola, and Seminole under contract with Embrace Families. Embrace Families notified DCF that they could not continue to serve as the lead agency in 2023. As Embrace Families closed, CHS was left with unpaid invoices totaling over \$1.3 million for services provided to children in the child welfare system.
